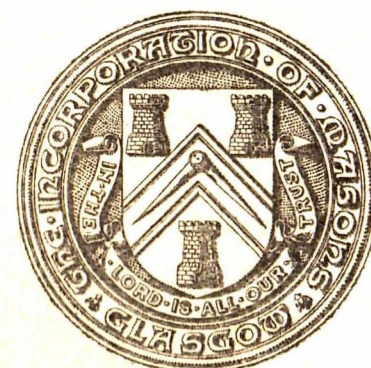
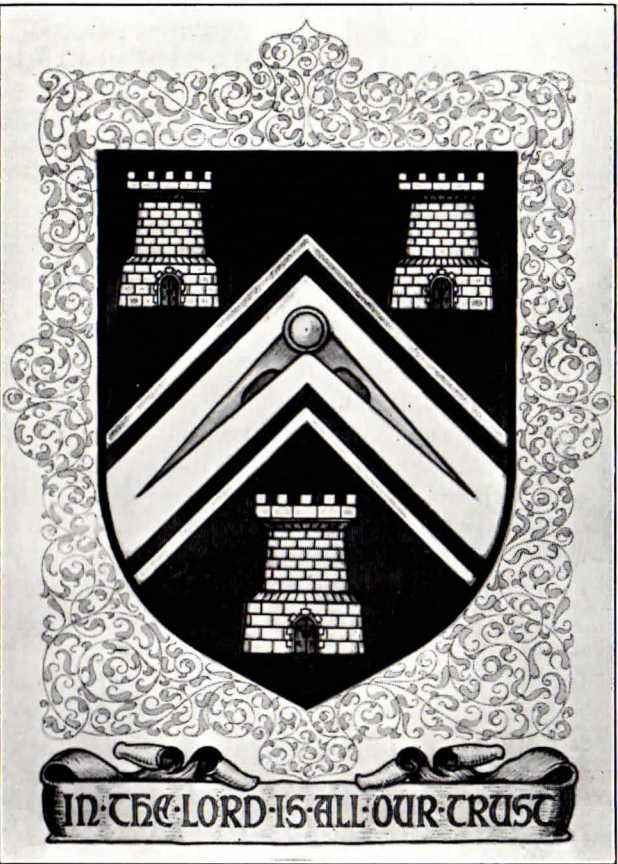

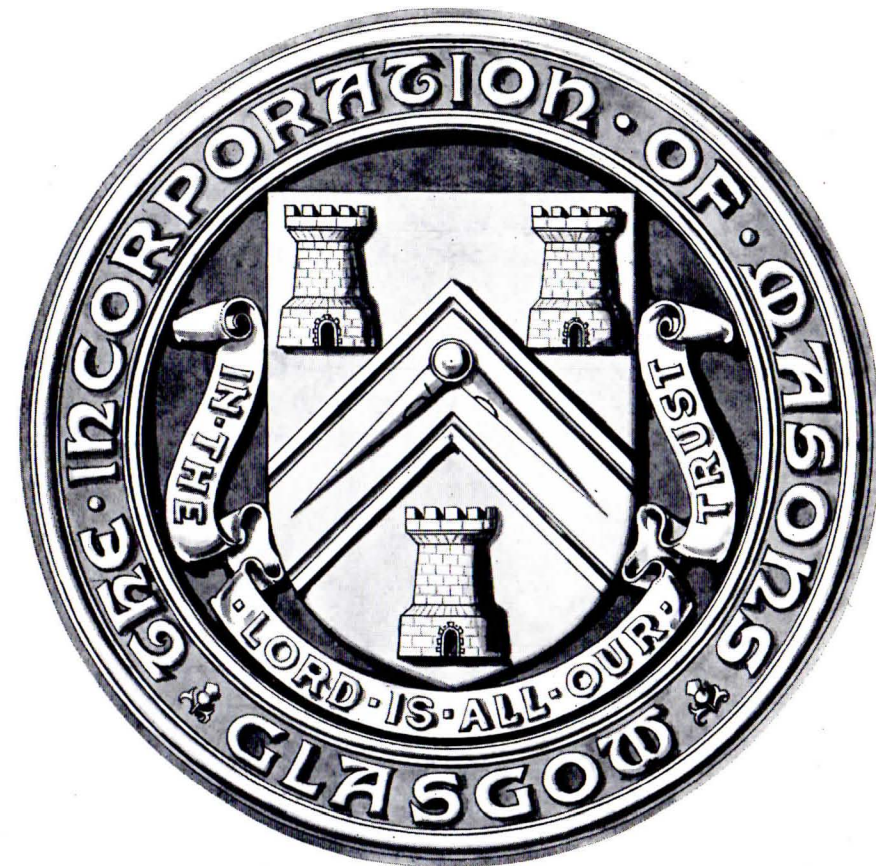
THE COAT OF ARMS.

To All and Sundry whom these Presents

Do or May Concern, We, Sir James Balfour Paul, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Doctor of Laws, Lord Lyon King of Arms, Send Greeting: Whereas The + Deacon, The Collector, The Late Deacon, The Late Collector and + Remanent Members of The Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow, have by Petition of date the thirtieth day of January ultimo, Represented that the said Incorporation of Masons is one of the fourteen ancient Incorporated Trades of Glasgow: that the Petitioners are in possession of records of the Incorporation dating from the year 1603: And Whereas the said Petitioners have Prayed that We Would + Grant our Licence and Authority unto them and to the said Incorporation of Masons to bear and use such Ensigns Armorial as might be found suitable and according to the Laws of Arms: Know ye therefore that We have Devised and Do by these Presents Assign, Ratify and Confirm unto the Petitioners and to the said Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow, the following Ensigns Armorial as depicted upon the + margin hereof and matriculated of even date with these presents in Our Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland, viz., Azure, on a chevron between two cotises and accompanied by three towers, two in chief and one in base all Argent the last masoned Sable, a pair + of compasses proper, and in an Escrol below the shield this Motto, "IN THE LORD IS ALL OUR TRUST": In Testimony whereof + these Presents are subscribed by Us and the Seal of Our Office is appended hereunto at Edinburgh the nineteenth day of February in the seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord, George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and + Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, + Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, etc., and in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

EXCERPT FROM
BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS
OF

The Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow

As Adopted by a General Meeting of that Incorporation, and as Amended and Enacted by the Trades House of Glasgow on the 30th day of January, 1879, as the Bye-Laws and Regulations of the Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow, to be in force from said 30th day of January, 1879,

and incorporating therein

Alterations from time to time subsequently made by the Incorporation, and Ratified and Enacted by the Trades House, and being, with said Alterations, the Bye-Laws and Regulations in force from and after 8th June, 1917.



XIII. MANAGEMENT AND INVESTMENT OF FUNDS.

“ The securities for any investment shall be taken either (1) as hitherto in the names of the Deacon and Collector for the time being and their successors in office for behoof of the Incorporation, or, (2) in the name of The Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow. All deeds and writs, obligations, and documents, to be granted by the Incorporation shall, according to use and wont, be subscribed on behalf of the Incorporation by the Deacon and Collector for the time being. The Seal of the Incorporation shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of the Deacon and the Collector, and in presence of, either the Deacon or the Collector, and of the Clerk of the Incorporation, or (if the Clerk be not available at the time) such other person as the Deacon and the Collector may appoint for the purpose; and the Deacon and Collector shall sign every document to which the Seal of the Incorporation is so affixed.”
